60 years of German-Kenyan diplomatic relations 50 Years of German-East African Science and Research Cooperation

Status Quo and Perspectives Nairobi, 20. September 2023

Context

In September 2023, the DAAD regional office for East Africa will celebrate its 50th anniversary. For half a century, the DAAD, with its staff, lecturers and a large science network, has been providing information in Eastern Africa about Germany as a destination for study and research and promoting funding opportunities, scholarships and university cooperation. Germany is a well-respected partner country for higher education, for business and in political relations. German-East African academic relations, together with diplomatic relations, which look back on 60 years in 2023, have shaped the biographies of many African academics and alumni and are visible in the regional diversity, in the diversity of cultures, subject disciplines and academic traditions.

Objectives

On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the AS Nairobi with regional responsibility for East Africa, German-East African academic and research relations are to be highlighted: Status quo, presentation of ongoing projects and cooperations and discussion on future cooperation and perspectives for even stronger research activities. The focus will be on topics related to the SDGs and politically relevant for the global South (climate change, food security, health care, access to education, freedom of science, etc.). The political context with 60 years of diplomatic relations forms the framework for the panel discussions and poster exhibition.

Presentations will be given on current developments in Germany as a research destination, scientific relations will be examined in a timeline of the last 50 years and perspectives for future university and research cooperation will be discussed.

Participants

Researchers and scientists who are involved in German-East African scientific relations are invited to the Science Forum Nairobi from all countries within the responsibility of the DAAD regional office - Ethiopia, Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, South Sudan, Uganda and Tanzania. Representatives from politics, ministries, business and civil society will be involved in the forum. Attention will be paid to a balanced distribution according to subject areas, funding programmes, gender and age.







Scientists and scholars can subscribe to the forum. Participation is free of charge. The organisers do not cover travel and accommodation costs.

Event format

The one-day event on 20 September 2023 is planned with attendance for up to 100 researchers and guests. The hybrid format with livestreaming will allow as many other researchers from the region and partners from Germany to participate. There will be a kick-off event with greetings and a keynote address, two panel discussions, presentations on the scientific landscape in Germany and East Africa, and a poster gallery walk.
